There are furthers details and the registration form on our website (https://www.tccem.org.au/register_for_training). Please note that this training day requires 2 or 3 hours of pre-reading.




Uniting Church President's Conference

Leave your nets and follow me. . . .

This was the call of the first disciples who left behind what they were doing in life and just followed Jesus. Jesus didn't wait for them to be trained, to be formed, to be what he needed them to be first. They learnt on the job as they went. Jesus also didn't call the perfect, right, best possible people. He took a rag-tag mob who were responsive to the invitation to give it a go.

We're very good in church life to want to have people trained up, formed and right before we give them responsibilities to do and be in the life of the church. But

I would never have been open to the call of ministry if I hadn't first given just living as a disciple with all the foibles and mistakes I brought. I learnt to follow as I lived. Wherever I was whatever I was doing. As a sister, daughter, student, nurse, server and intentional community participant, as a wife, mother etc all of these spaces in life have been places where God has said, come follow me, love people, serve people as I might, and be who I need you to be. I don't want you perfect, I don't want you right, I don't want you trained - I just want you to be the best you can be at any given moment in time. Sometimes those moments shine, sometimes they are less than ordinary. But I am first and foremost a learning disciple of Christ.

Where in life are you giving being a disciple a go? Where do you love another? Where do you show the goodness of God and who do you share that with in the ordinary moments of life? How do you live out what it is to be a learning disciple of Christ? Who helps you do to do that? And who are you helping to that with too?

We don't have to get it right, be right, have it right before we are asked to come and follow. We don't have to get it right, be right or have it right, before Jesus shows us who, where and when we can act as learning disciples. Today, we can do so today
