The Synod meets approximately every 18 months to hear reports, discern proposals, and discuss matters that concern the general oversight, direction and administration of the life of the Church in Victoria and Tasmania.

Due to potential restrictions that are likely to be caused by COVID-19 impacts over the months ahead, the Synod meeting has been deferred until February 2021 and will be held as a virtual (online only) meeting, over a shorter period than usual.

The meeting will be over three days, meeting about five hours each day in a few blocks of time.

Rather than a challenge, the Synod Business Committee invites the Church to see the opportunities which this new way of meeting presents.

People from across the Church are invited to consider nominating people who may not normally be able to attend a 5-day in-person meeting, but could attend a three-day virtual meeting (meeting c. 5 hours each day, in a few blocks of time),


COVID-19 update:

stay safe,

risks are still real

- Follow health authority advice, and if unwell for any reason, stay home and stay safe
- Maintain safe practices for church gatherings, including 'maximum density' and physical distancing
- Holy Communion and hospitality need careful attention to ensure everyone feels safe, and remains safe

Our health authorities continue to remind us that transmission of COVID-19 remains a real risk as people continue to travel internationally to Australia including Tasmania. The highly-transmissible UK



variant of the virus has reached Australia, but is being contained by quarantine and safe practices.

'Chains of transmission' only become evident afterwards, so maintain safe practices for local church gatherings, and especially for Holy Communion and hospitality (morning tea, lunch, or Pancake Day).

Careful planning can ensure these faithful practices can remain safe, as healthy leaders ensure participants remain safe, and avoid any unsafe physical contact between people. 'Maximum density' rules (2sqm/person) and physical distancing guidelines and are still in place.

During the year Harry has served the school community in a number of ways, including a Year 3 Education Outdoors Program where he demonstrated leadership skills and excelled in promoting an inclusive and supportive environment for these young students. Harry also participated as a student leader in a school collaboration between Scotch Oakburn, St Mary's District School and Bicheno Primary School. The main aim of the project was to provide the east coast schools with a transition event for Year 6 students in an adventure-based setting. Harry was part of group that led one of the rotation activities, and therefore interacted with all the younger students during the course of the day. He exhibited a very patient and nurturing demeanour as he guided the Year 6 students through a range of challenges. Harry has excellent communication skills which he used to clearly outline what was required to complete this particular activity.
