

The UCA turned 46 on June 22, a date that also marked the conclusion of Uniting in Prayer - a time of prayer nationally across the Church as part of the Act2 project, as we consider the future shape of the Uniting Church.

Recalling the courageous journey we embarked on 46 years ago, President Sharon Hollis invites us to listen anew to the invitation to find ourselves in God's story, asking ... "What is God's new thing for us today?"

Are we willing to courageously answer Christ's call in this time and place?"

In a video message, Sharon considers the particular call this year to support an Aboriginal and Torres

Strait Islander Voice to Parliament. She reflects on the call to be shaped by God's inclusive life and to receive with joy the gifts of the LGBTIQA+ community. She invites us to seek to be allies of those on the margins and to stand against racism and exclusion.

In our own life as a Church, Sharon asks if we can commit anew to sharing with others what it means to have new life in Christ, and to forge a future of faithful innovation, discipleship and community. The beginning of the video features Rev Dr Davis McCaughey, inaugural President of the Uniting Church, preaching at the Uniting Church service of inauguration at Sydney Town Hall on June 22 1977.

From Graham near Hardenberg in The Netherlands, a wanderer on the Way. To the saints who are in Tasmania, who are faithful in Christ Jesus: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Greetings from the borderlands.

I am following the Pieterpad from Pieterburen (neighbourhood near Saint Peter) to Saint Peter, a mountain near Maastricht. This is most of the length of the border between The Netherlands and Germany.

Peter was very much a man who spoke out before always putting his brain into gear. Yet the faith of this guy was enough to shove leadership on his shoulders and that he understood some of the implications of Jesus's death is affirmed in the legends about his own death. Something to think about as we are walking.

When we are walking long distances, and this walk is something over 490km, seeing the whole task is daunting. In the face of this we use the teacher's skill of breaking things down into manageable chunks - how much is done in a day, how many hundred metres to the next canal or through that section of woods, and ultimately to at least I can do that next step.

When walking, we follow the path in our mind or that laid down in the guidebook taking note of the markers indicating the correct path or a change of direction.

It's a bit like life really.
